LATE/NON- SUBMISSION OF Portfolio

If a student is unable to submit the portfolio on or by the

due date, the penalty for late submission will be 5% (of the possible mark) for each day the assessment is late and after one week the mark will be zero. **Without the submission of the Portfolios in all modules, the certificate will not be issued.**
